## Northwestern State University submitted by Anna Tapia MacDonald

Librarians **Debbie Huntington** and **Anna Tapia MacDonald** presented a Lunch and Learn in February for the College of Business & Technology on using the *Learning Express* database for student success and the *Living Library* program at Northwestern State University.

On February 20<sup>th</sup>, **Debbie Huntington** and the *Living Library* Team hosted the 2<sup>nd</sup> *Living Library* event which honored the late Ben Johnson. The panel of speakers consisted of relatives, friends, and mentees. The panelists were: Claire Prymus (niece of Mr. Johnson), Dr. Marcus Jones, Mr. Edward Ward, Dr. Johnny Cox, and State Representative Kenny Cox. The event also commemorated Black History Month by sharing how a young man from Campti with \$2.75 in his pocket and a dream became an entrepreneur, civic leader, mentor, philanthropist, and advocate in the Natchitoches African American community. His legacy lives on today through the Ben D. Johnson Education Center, the Legacy Youth Workforce Development Program, and the Legacy Café.

The **Watson Library Programming & Outreach Committee** organized a week of midterms events at the Library. Events included a workshop called "Tackle Test Anxiety," yoga in the stacks, stress-free coloring and craft station, and a popular grand prize gift bag drawing.

#### Cammie G. Henry Research Center

On February 6, Assistant Archivist **Sharon Wolff** was appointed as a committee member of the NSU Louisiana Studies Conference and Louisiana High School Essay Contest focused on planning and implementing the NSU Louisiana Studies Conference in mid-September.

Wernet and Wolff attended the Q&A session conducted by Yvonne Dooley, the Copyright Specialist at the University of North Texas, and Emilie Algenio, Copyright/Fair Use Librarian at Texas A&M University Libraries.
