Edith Garland Dupré Library received the Louisiana Endowment for the Humanities (LEH) grant *Who Gets to Vote?*. The reading and book discussion series was funded by LEH through the "Why it Matters: Civic and Electoral Participation" initiative, administered by the Federation of State Humanities Councils and funded by the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation. The series was developed by LEH and is intended to engage members of the public in conversations on the history of voting rights in the United States. **Tiffany Ellis, Zachary Stein**, and **Cheylon Woods** were the principal investigators. Two UL Lafayette faculty scholars facilitated the book discussions.

The Library was awarded two technology grants from the University's Student Technology Enhancement Program. Heather Plaisance and Blair Stapleton were principal investigators for a \$26,250 grant to replace the computers in the Reference Department and add webcams and headsets with microphones. Another technology grant, for \$35,654, funded the replacement of the desktop scanners located throughout the library for student use.
